What Does It Mean to Have Faith in God?

"Yet we know that a person is justified not by the works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ. And we have come to believe in Christ Jesus, so

that we might be justified by faith in Christ, and not by doing the works of the law, because no one will be justified by the works of the law" (Gal 2:16 NRSV).

If we asked Christians to define faith, we would receive a variety of answers based on Hebrews 11:1-3: "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible." The answers might include "trust," especially in something unseen, or perhaps "conviction," a firm belief in spite of evidence to the contrary.

However, faith is a complex human experience that is more than merely an intellectual affirmation or even simply an act of trust. The apostle Paul recognizes this complexity by first connecting faith to Christ's death on the cross. The cross signifies the ultimate covenantal expression of Christ's obedience and faithfulness to God as well as His self-giving love for us (Rom 3:22; 5:18-19; Gal 3:22; Phil 2:6-8; 3:9). While Christ's obedience constitutes the *objective* basis of faith, there is also a *subjective* (or *existential*) basis in the believer's experience of *sharing* or *participating* in that death (Rom 6:1-11).

In practice, faith is the way we, as recipients, relate appropriately to God and His special gift of Jesus our Lord. Faith acknowledges our nothingness before God and affirms our dependence on Him. Faith beckons us to respond positively to God's generosity and grace. By faith we understand that we do not simply exist to live our lives with ease and enjoyment, to accumulate possessions and power, to receive accolades and enlarge our egos. This is how faith lives: "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:19b-20).

To have faith in God is to allow Him to work in and through us for the well-being of all creation. In sum, faith might be defined as "empty hands held open for God to fill" for His own purposes (Martin Luther). May we experience this life of faith as we enter the New Year!

Plans A and B have hit a brick wall. Do I force either of these just to meet the deadline? No. The Lord knew all along what I should tell you about.

You have heard about this book since last April and now you are going to hear about it in detail. This book is truly a gift from God. Last January I sat down and started reading Walking Toward Christmas: Devotions for Advent by Eric Dean Patterson and it became obvious that the Lord wanted him to be a guest author at our Celebrate Christian Literature event. And so, last April, he was. If you didn't get your own copy of his book, the library has a copy to borrow. If you missed reading it at Christmas, it is still a great read.

Eric Patterson is quite candid in the preface when he states that he found "Christmas to be spiritually passé." Yes, there are plenty of activities, "programs," and busy-ness of the season, yet it lacks the spiritual depth found in Lent leading to Easter.

With a trip to the Parkwood website and a few more clicks, you are "in" the library viewing a vast array of titles of books, DVDs, CDs, children's books, study materials, Bibles in various versions, biographies, fiction, non-fiction, etc. So where you are looking for a subject, such as family life, or an author, such as Max Lucado, or a specific book, such as "Undaunted," you will learn whether we have it, and if so, whether it is available or currently checked out. Follow these step-by-step instructions and you will be on your way to adventure and learning in the library!

- Go to www.parkwood.org
- Click on RESOURCES at top right of the home page
- Click on OUR DATABASE or PBC LIBRARY DATABASE in the Parkwood Patterson Memorial Library section
- Type in word(s) you are looking for in a title, author, subject, or series
- Click the respective box to search for your title, author, subject, or series (EXAMPLE: Miller is author's last name; then click on AUTHOR)
- Scroll through listing for entry you are seeking; if checked out, it will say OUT in far right column

Click the back arrow to start a new search

 Click on the X to close the database at the end of your search
