The Purpose of Sunday School at Parkwood

At Parkwood we recognize that Sunday School is a multi-purpose ministry, a 24/7/365 network of care, prayer, communication, and outreach.

The primary focus of the Sunday School ministry at Parkwood is to share God's love and grace, as revealed in Jesus Christ, with people of all nations through a collective study of the Scriptures. We come together as one body to study God's Word, and to encourage and strengthen one another through communal prayer. Moreover, Sunday School offers us a unique opportunity to carry out the mandate of our Lord Jesus in Matthew 28:18-20:

"Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Empowered by the Holy Spirit, the Sunday School ministry at Parkwood seeks to cultivate:

- > the culture of invitation: a concerted effort by both teacher and class members to invite people to their class.
- the psychology of invitation: a mindset that both teacher and class members expect new people to be present any given Sunday
- the theology of invitation: a conviction that God wants believers to invite others to Bible study
- the sociology of invitation: an intentional effort to remain open to newcomers.

Our Sunday School Teachers:

- are well prepared for their classes
- know their material and are excited about its delivery
- acknowledge newcomers present and ensure that all are acquainted and comfortable
- entertain prayer requests
- encourage a lively discussion and interaction
- know that Sunday School hits the bull's eye by reaching people, teaching people, and ministering to people.

the Alzheimer's Association who can offer handouts about how the association can help.



Who Let The Dogs Out?

She came and worshipped him, pleading again, "Lord, help me!"

Have you ever been in the doghouse? I have. As a 23-year old, it felt so good when my great-aunt trusted me enough to leave me alone in her home for two weeks while she traveled. Her only directive to me was to make sure that I watered her houseplants. Two days before her expected return, I had a friend over and as we enjoyed lunch, I received an invite to hang out with friends. Excitedly, I rushed out of the house, determined to return later that same day to clean up the messes we'd left in the kitchen and dining room.

I will spare you the details, but let's just say that I didn't return home until 7:00 pm the next day, only to be met by the cold and piercing stares of my great-aunt and her daughter, who had some choice words for me. Not only had I left the kitchen a mess, but I had forgotten to water her houseplants! Unfortunately for me, my aunt had decided to come home a day early and what she saw is what put me in the doghouse.

Several years ago, a silly song titled, Who Let the Dogs Out, became a world-wide sensation. I still have no idea what the song was about, but it had a catchy hook that reminds me of the story in Matthew 15:21-28. Many in the Jewish community looked at the Gentiles as dogs who had been unleashed to compete for the same miracles and blessings that the Jews sought from Jesus. They failed to realize that Jesus also loved the Gentiles, so he had to use his encounter with this Canaanite woman to teach them a few things. Regardless of what society thought of this woman, Jesus was impressed that she worshipped him, and demonstrated faith in his ability to make a difference in her life. Her daughter was possessed by a demon so she cried out, Have mercy on me, O Lord, thou son of David; my daughter is grievously vexed with a devil. Notice how she acknowledged that she was talking to the Messiah.

I like this woman. Even after Jesus had tested her faith by referring to her as a dog, she still persisted. At least she was a "dog" who had the sense enough to know that faith and worship moves God. Her wise reply was, True, Lord: yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table. Amazingly, her daughter was healed that very hour.

No matter what society thinks of us, as Christians, we have that same access to God's miracles. And if you ever find yourself in the doghouse with someone, first apologize. Then remember that you can get relief by adding sincere worship and faith to your request for mercy. Like me, you will probably need it!

We make resolutions that state our goals. "I want to improve my diet." "I want to read the Bible more." "I want to exercise regularly." All are great ideas and it is our "intention" to follow through but many times that is as far as it goes. The word "Invention" means "change or innovation." This is our goal, isn't it? To change. To grow. To become more of what we were meant to be. This requires more than good "intentions." It will require work. Making a plan. Doing it. Getting someone else involved to hold you accountable.

So, I want to challenge you to "invent" change into your life in 2013! One good invention is better than a long list of intentions!
