God is counting on us to be healthy disciples and disciple-makers. Let us take our discipleship seriously and be faithful to the mission that God has given to us.



How sin came, "Fall of man" which brought spiritual death. Genesis 3:1-24

March Book Bite

"Implosion" by Joel C. Rosenberg A Review by Roger Larson

I was introduced to Joel Rosenberg by a Christian friend. Joel reveals his deep biblical knowledge by reviewing events and trends through the third lens, the light of Bible prophecy. In my opinion, this book should be read by every Christian in America.

These are not normal times; we are living in the Last Days. The rebirth of Israel is very significant. What will happen to America? Joel provides a number of scenarios which include financial implosion, war and terrorism, natural disasters, and the rapture. All or one of these could end America as we know it today.

Our only hope is for a third great spiritual awakening. Can America again be a shining city on the hill? Why is God shaking us up? He loves us and wants to wake us up and turn to Christ

- He wants us to realize that there is no one else who can give us true peace and security
- He has a mission for his church and each of his followers
- Jesus Christ is coming back soon and time is running out

The First Great Awakening (1700-1760's) was led by Jonathan Edwards, George Whitefield, and John and Charles Wesley and resulted in the founding of America. Many people forget about our Christian heritage. The Second Great Awakening (1800-1850s) happened after the moral decline following the Revolutionary War. It was led by Francis Asbury, Timothy Dwight, and Charles Finney when God showed tremendous grace and mercy to America during this dark time. Will God in his grace and mercy allow the American people to experience a Third Great Awakening? Revival in America will begin with our individual spiritual revival which could allow God to cause a Third Great Awakening.

The second-most important question is this: How will we invest our time, talent and treasure now, before either revival or implosion comes? The author suggests the book of Joel for guidance. Steps include: Reject fear, Resist anger, Rekindle love for Jesus, Repent of your sins, Recommit to study of God's word, Rediscover the power of prayer and fasting, Recommit to a local church congregation, Reach out to unsaved and share the Gospel, Reach out to a younger believer and make a disciple.

America is on the brink of a collapse. What role should Christians play in politics? The author suggests:

- Pray faithfully and consistently for wisdom and direction for our national leaders
- Exercise your right to vote; mobilize others to vote as well
- Run for elected office, serve in some governmental capacity or serve as advisors to national leaders who are affecting the future of our country
- Some Christians need to stay completely away from politics
- Do not become addicted to partisanship

To save our nation we need to find the purpose and the plan God has for our life and do it with all our heart.

Slluminations All I Need Is The Air That I Breathe

The Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul. (Genesis 2:7)

He is the alpha and the omega. He is Jesus, the breath of our lives; the one who give us meaning, purpose and validation. Regardless of our worldly accomplishments and human accolades, without him, we can do nothing. Without him, we cannot even breathe.

I remember picking up my guitar years ago and trying to work out the chord changes to The Hollie's hit song, *All I Need Is The Air That I Breathe*. Some of you might remember that song and chorus: "Sometimes, all I need is the air that I breathe, and to love you." For Christians, not just some of the time, but at all times we need the air that we breathe, and to love our God, who has supplied that air for us. You see, for believers this air is more than mere oxygen. It is also the very presence of the God of the universe who lives on the inside of us. As you ponder that thought, take a deep breath; hold it, and then exhale.

Recently, CNN did a story about the fast-growing atheist movement. As I watched the video, which featured one man who mockingly denied the existence of God, I wondered who these people think gave them the air that they breathe. You see, whether atheists acknowledge it or not, God is the one who sustains their lives. He is also the air that they breathe; they simply choose to not have a personal relationship with him.

However, as believers it is to our benefit to remain humble before God since we are so dependent upon Him. I think sometimes we start to "smell ourselves," as the old people in my neighborhood used to say. Perhaps you've heard some say that one has "gotten too big for his britches," after he's been educated and has accomplished a few things. But just think about the air that we breathe every second of every day. None of us have actually earned that privilege. It is a gift from God.

Now, just breathe.

Life in the Parentheses

"(Bezalel son of Uri, the son of Hur, of the tribe of Judah, made everything the Lord commanded Moses.)" -Ex. 38:22

After Israel was delivered from bondage in Egypt they began to establish who they were and who they were going to be. God gave them the Ten Commandments and specific instructions on constructing a tabernacle to the Lord. Many chapters of Exodus are dedicated to the details of this fresh start for a newly freed nation. The instructions are overwhelming as God reveals Himself as a "detail" person.
