

PARKWOOD.....On Mission



We are off to a great year with efforts. In January we sent more Navajo Bibles to our churches Word and can read it in their own language.

In February Pastor Mike joined me in Albuquerque. We helped distribute food with Rose Ignacio at Tinian Baptist near Torreon, New Mexico; met with Rev. Dan Clymer at Jemez Valley Baptist; had dinner with Pastor went to the San Juan Baptist Association office in Farmington, NM to meet with Karen Ray, the office manager; met with Rev. Ken Testament Full Gospel Indian Church near Shonto, and Pastor Elizabeth Bryant, before returning to Albuquergue to meet with the staff of the Central Baptist Association. 1,300 ground miles in three and a half days across the mesas and the mountains!

We were blessed to have Pastor Rick Begay and his wife, Nadine visit us in April. Rick is a tremendous pastor with a fascinating life story.

Over the past four years Parkwood our Native American Missions members have generously donated: clothing, money for Bibles, seminary scholarships, and disaster relief. We have brought pastors and so that the Navaio have the Rose Ignacio here, and have sent our members and staff out there. But we have received far more than we have given. This is especially true for me. I have received spiritual blessings beyond description. The Navajo, in particular, treat me like family.

I am also reminded of a conversation Rick Begay of Mesa Baptist in Sanostee, NM; with Rose Ignacio this past summer. Jane and I were at Tinian for the monthly food distribution. Most of the food is donated by "Anglo" churches and other organizations. Before Greenwell at Beclabito Baptist near the Four starting the distribution, Rose offered a prayer. Corners; headed out to Kayenta, Arizona to I've picked up a little Navajo over time: meet with Pastor James Tunney of the New enough to say and recognize an few words and phrases. I heard the word "Belagana," which means Caucasians. Later that night at dinner I jokingly asked Rose if she was talking about me during the prayer. She said no, that what she said was "This food came not from the Belagana, but from God." I have remembered that comment. What we give comes not from ourselves, but from God.

I Will Always Love You

With everlasting love I will have compassion on you," says the Lord, your Redeemer. - <u>Isaiah 54:8</u>

Humanly speaking, we do our best to love unconditionally. However, only God can demonstrate an unwavering *always* kind of love. The word *always* takes on a different meaning with God, who knows all about us, but still chooses to love us anyway. Just let that marinate for a minute: *anyway* and *always*.

Now, unless you were already a big fan of Dolly Parton in the early 1970's, you may not have known that she penned the notes and lyrics to the beautiful song, *I Will Always Love You*. Then in 1992, Whitney Houston commanded worldwide acclaim when she put her own vocal spin on the song for the romantic thriller, "The Body-guard." Her version made us all stop and think of that special someone whom we will *always* love. But it was Whitney's a cappella opening that first captured our attention. "If I should stay, I would only be in your way. So I'll go, but I know I'll think of you every step of the way. And I will always love you. I will always love you."

Even within Christian circles, an *always* love can be a difficult concept to grasp. Nevertheless, if you know someone who has strayed away and stayed away, please try to assure that individual that God will never stop loving them, no matter what. Tell them to talk to God who will compassionately receive them. (See Isaiah 1:18). Now, if you are the one who is drowning in that sea of uncertainty, then that reminder is for you.

Many Christians dwell more on the guilt of their mistakes rather than on God's love for them. Perhaps, they don't really believe that God's love covers a multitude of sins. Many have even left the faith entirely because of guilt. And sadly, we make it hard for people to want to return to the faith after they have strayed, because we fail to win them back with an *always* kind of love. But, it is a liberty that is not ours to take. If the Lord welcomes people back, then so should we.

Moreover, the kind of love that Ms. Parton wrote about is temporal, but God's love transcends all things; including time. And unlike the person in these lyrics, Jesus did not go away because He thought He would be in our way. Nor did He leave because He wanted to sever His relationship with us. To the contrary, before He left, He actually *solidified* His love for us at Calvary. (John 14:1-5).

Finally, our Lord is also *always* thinking of us. What kind of crazy love is that? It is a love that is deep and pure. It is a love that does not keep score of our faults. It is an everlasting love; an *always* love. It is the kind of love that humbles me. And I am forever grateful.

A full life is more than just being happy all the time. James' words above tell us that what we consider "trials" are necessary for us to mature and become all we were meant to be..."complete."

So, go for the "gusto" this Summer! Live life to the fullest. It is what God wants you to do. Embrace it all, the joys and the trials. Trust Him in all you do!
